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Greetings from Legan Foundation

In recent years, Hong Kong has continued to develop as a diverse and closely connected city. The proportion of ethnic minority families in local communities has gradually increased. Every resident, regardless of skin color, language, or cultural background, has their own unique family story. When we observe that different members of the community have different needs, we can also recognize that community resources may not always be distributed in the most balanced or complete way.

The strength of a community does not only come from the amount of resources available. It also depends on whether these resources can be distributed fairly and used by those who truly need them. Educational support, language learning opportunities, family activities, and stronger community networks can help bridge cultural differences. When children and families of different backgrounds can benefit together, we move one step closer towards sustainable development.

Looking ahead, while continuing to support underprivileged groups and grassroots families, we also hope to strengthen the integration of ethnic minority communities. At the same time, we aim to provide long-term support by building connections with different organizations and community groups. Through stronger support networks and better resource allocation, materials, energy, and food can reach the places where they are most needed. This helps prevent situations where some have excesses while others face shortages. It also reduces waste and improves the effectiveness of recycling and environmental protection efforts.



Activities from April to December 2025

Sham Shui Po Tutorial Centre Sponsorship



Children from grassroots families often face multiple challenges during their learning journey. These include a lack of appropriate academic support, limited resources at home, and parents who may be busy with work and unable to provide sufficient guidance. Because of this, some students are unable to receive timely and targeted academic support, which may gradually affect their academic performance, confidence, and motivation to learn. In certain cases, accumulated pressure can also lead to conflicts with parents and create tension within the family.

For ethnic minority families, the situation can be even more complex. Language barriers, cultural differences, and challenges in social integration create additional difficulties. Children may experience greater pressure adapting to school life, while parents may find it difficult to communicate with schools due to language limitations. As a result, the need for support becomes even more urgent.

In recent years, the number of non-Chinese families in the Sham Shui Po district has increased significantly. In response, Legan Foundation has decided to provide rental sponsorship for the community initiative "Sham Shui Po Study Centre". The centre is formed by a group of experienced retired professionals, including a former primary school principal, psychiatric nurses, registered social workers, and senior teachers. The initiative aims to respond to community needs by providing tutoring support for ethnic minority families in Sham Shui Po. It helps students overcome learning difficulties and provides comprehensive support in areas such as language ability, study skills, and emotional management. We believe this will allow children to grow and learn in a more stable and supportive environment.

Yan Kei Community Service Centre

In 2024, Yan Kei Community Service Centre officially launched the two-year programme, "Lighten Up Vision 2024", which aims to address the needs of grassroots families and ethnic minority communities in Sham Shui Po in areas such as education and family support. The programme has now reached its mid stage.

One of the programme's key objectives is to focus on the needs of ethnic minority families in the district. Due to language barriers and cultural differences, non-Chinese students often face greater challenges in school life and community integration. To address this, one of the major activities is Chinese tutoring classes specifically for them. Starting with basic language skills, the classes help students improve their communication abilities, increase their participation in school activities, and gradually integrate into community life.

In addition to academic support, the centre also organizes a range of family activities. These include evening parent child gatherings where guest speakers are invited to share topics related to parenting and family education. These activities help build a supportive community network while providing families with a space to relax, share experiences, and better understand one another.

The programme also includes family outings and festive celebrations. These activities allow family members to interact in a relaxed and enjoyable environment, improve communication, and strengthen emotional bonds. They also help relieve the pressures of daily life and enhance parents' confidence and ability in raising their children. Participants have generally responded positively to the activities, reflecting that the direction and outcomes of the programme are in line with expectations.

Overall, "Lighten Up Vision 2024" is built on educational support, centred on strengthening family relationships, and extended through community connections. The programme aims to create a more stable and hopeful environment for grassroots and ethnic minority families in the Sham Shui Po district.



Mid-Autumn Book Donation to Kam Tsin Village Ho Tung School



In September, Legan Foundation donated a collection of well preserved and clean secondhand books to Kam Tsin Village Ho Tung School. The books include storybooks, extracurricular reading materials, and basic knowledge books. The aim is to provide students with more diverse reading resources and to encourage them to develop an interest in reading as part of their daily lives through this festive gift. Through this donation, Legan Foundation hopes to encourage students to make good use of their time by reading. This Mid-Autumn donation is slightly different from previous years. In addition to giving books to students, Legan Foundation also hopes to promote a culture of resource sharing within the community.

In addition to the donated materials, the Foundation hopes to continue identifying secondhand bookstores and reading promotion groups within the community. The goal is to collect more well-preserved books that are suitable for reading. By working with different organizations, the Foundation hopes to circulate valuable books within the community so that individuals and organizations in need can benefit. This also helps reduce resource waste and supports the idea of sustainable development.



Parent Child Snow Skin Mooncake Workshop for Mid-Autumn Festival

The Parent-child Snow Skin Mooncake Workshop for the Mid-Autumn Festival was organized by the Yan Kei Community Centre and held in Cheung Sha Wan on 4 October 2025. The activity aimed to give parents and children an opportunity to spend time together despite their busy daily lives. By making mooncakes together, families could strengthen interaction and communication while allowing children to experience the joy of traditional festival culture through hands-on activities.

Volunteers from Legan Foundation also participated in the event and worked alongside residents from Cheung Sha Wan. In addition to making mooncakes together, the volunteers assisted families in completing the mooncake making process and helped with the overall coordination and cleanup of the event. Through companionship and interaction, the volunteers helped bring a sense of warmth and support to the community during the festival.

We believe that the activity is not only a hands-on workshop but also a platform that brings the community together. Through participation across different families and backgrounds, stronger connections can be formed, and children can learn the values of cooperation and sharing. Legan Foundation hopes that through activities like this, it can continue to promote community inclusion so that festivals become not only a celebration but also a source of mutual support and companionship within the community.
